## WHAT IS YOUTH SPACE FIFE?

Youth Space Fife is a youth work programme for young people aged 13 - 25 that live in Fife.

Starting in 2015 as an initiative from the Fife Council CLD strategy team with the remit of engaging young people in youth work online, it has evolved over the last 10 years to delivering primarily Creative and Digital Youth Work sessions in all the 7 areas of Fife.

The primary purpose of the project is to increase the health, wellbeing, skills and sense of autonomy that young people need to thrive. Secondarily to promote creativity and community as a means of achieving these.

The project is steered by Young People's interests and the Youth Workers skill sets. We aim to make decisions in dialogue with young people involved in the project which has led us to do a wide variety of activities including:

- Filmmaking
- Photography
- Podcasting
- Dungeons & Dragons
- Animation
- Drama
- Zine making
- Futures sessions (life coaching)

## THE LAST FEW MONTHS...

YOUth Space has seen big changes since our last project report.

We finished some significant work in 2024 so 2025 held lots of opportunity, in January we started two new groups, one in Fife College and the other at the new Learning Campus in Dunfermline.

By far the biggest change though was saying goodbye to our longest standing staff member Otto, who was their at the projects inception. He has moved on to become a Community Education worker in the East Neuk after completing his Degree and we are very proud of his determination, drive and the good work he is doing in that area..

He is missed and his legacy stands strong both within the team and how it works but also with the hundreds of young Fifers he worked for, as well as the local youth work teams he supported along the way.

As a result of Otto's departure we interviewed to fill his role and our very own Nick Venture was successful and moved into the senior position of project officer from his previous project assistant role.

This meant we had a new vacancy and after a few months and over 30 applicants we were delighted to welcome Rosie Handley to the team!

### AWARDS SEASON



In June we had a busy month being recognised for the work we do at Youth Space.

First up we had the National Youth Link Awards 2025, in the STEM category Nick was nominated for his work on our Dungeons and Dragons group.

### YOUTH SPACE STUDIO Fife College

In November 2024 we were invited to develop a group that would run out of Fife Colleges media spaces in Glenrothes, having access and utilising their podcast suites, radio room, TV Studio's and creative breakout spaces after hours.

**Outcomes:** 

Digital media skills, content produced, solid community developed, utilising spaces.

In January 2025 a pilot began and ran until June. An overall success, we are excited to announce we will return from September 10th to continue this group on Wednesday evenings.

Each session saw the attendees try out the various media rooms. Initially drawn to the podcast suite, the young people recorded some episodes around many topics.

## DUNGEONS & DRAGONS

Our Dungeons and Dragons group was created in 2022 and has now served two groups of young people online and at the Lomond Centre Glenrothes.

For those who have never played D&D it is a role-playing game, with a group story telling focus often in a fantasy setting. Players are encouraged to make choices often resulting in a cause and affect. A Dungeon masters is responsible for setting the scene and presenting challenges for players to overcome.

Over the past year our group have been taught the tools of running their own campaigns, starting with using 'Fractured Lands' a Youth Space created tool kit for training Dungeon Masters.

The success of this training enabled the Young people to take turns in producing and delivering 6 sessions of their own original D&D campaigns. A total of 4 campaigns were run ranging from fantasy, science fiction and Greek mythology.

## DUNGEONS & DRAGONS

#### **Outcomes:**

We set out for the group to become more youth led by giving young people the freedom to take over gameplay. Young people displayed improved confidence from leading the group, organisation skills from producing session plans, and creative problem solving when dealing with players making unexpected choices.

#### **Challenges:**

Shifting to more of a youth led approach as a worker was initially difficult when you have been the main storyteller for so long. One issue that never came up was Dungeon master's dedication to deliver every nominated session. It is a true credit to the young people having produced original campaigns with a beginning, middle and end.

#### What's next:

Seeing the continuing value of a D&D group we will be forming a new group of young people at Waid Academy in Anstruther. We will once again be delivering a two-year programme starting with a staff led campaign 'The Heart of Morgarth'.

Young people will learn how to create a character and participate in their first adventure. Upon the success of the coming year, we hope once again to offer our Dungeon Master training programme.

The prospect of closing out the current group has been difficult, but the group unprompted made a request to continue running independently with remote support. We are excited to hear how they progress into this new phase of being truly a youth led group.

#### **DUNFERMLINE LEARNING CAMPUS**

A filmmaking project utilising the newly built Learning Lab at the learning campus school building which has both St Columbas and Woodmill high schools under one roof.

The group worked together learning how to use professional equipment and film-making techniques to create their own short, which they filmed around the school.

After weeks of idea generation and storyboarding they began shooting and wrapped just before the summer holidays. The 'Bank Heist' film will be shown at the National Youth Film Festival which will be hosted at the learning campus on October 4th.

**Outcomes:** A short film, new skills learned, friendships formed, utilising spaces.

## TEMPLEHALL SUPPORT

#### **Purpose:**

To assist Local Development Officer Gordon Forbes in his consultation with the local population on Templehall's regeneration. Using photography, we have assisted young people in capturing the community from their perspective.

The initial idea was to facilitate a means for young people in Templehall to inform their experience with local services and the area in a positive way.

Through creative youth work we hope to continue building on positive relationships and activity that promotes wellbeing.

**Objective:** Initially to build capacity in youth work staff, later became giving new experiences and fresh perspective to the group of young people. The exhibition has also served as an opportunity for Gordon Forbes to hear about what changes locals would like to see in Templehall.

Activities: Exploration of local area, photography, art & culture exposure (galleries), curation

## SUMMER PROGRAMME

**Purpose:** Our Summer Programme gives an opportunity for our young people to participate in engaging creative activities during the school holidays. Most years we work in partnership with an organisation, this year our main partnership was with Dundee University and Wessex Archaeology.

**Activities:** Annual BBQ, D&D one shots, Cyanotype printing, Taskmaster, Archaeology.

### WHAT'S COMING UP?
